What is it?

Assessment supports the success of University of Arizona's strategic plan and priorities through data-driven continuous improvement. To build assessment capacity, the Assessment Institute was created as a signature professional development program led by the Office of Assessment, Research, and Grant Development. The year-long program seeks to provide UA staff with an opportunity to develop knowledge and hone their skills in conducting assessments within their unit and department. Who should attend?

New and mid-level professionals are invited to apply. Program content is aimed at those with emerging assessment knowledge and have an assessment need in mind for their unit/department. University of Arizona staff who work remotely or at a distance campus are also invited to apply. Zoom access with teleconference setup will be available for seamless interaction.

What is the commitment to participate?

There are two main components to the program: 1) Eight core modules with an hour per week of expected work time and 2) an Assessment Capstone Project. The core learning modules are <u>required</u> and occur during the fall semester on Thursdays from 8:30 - 10:30AM.

Participants will also plan and implement an assessment capstone project through the 2019-2020 year. Capstone projects are assessments mutually identified between participants and their supervisors and derive from an assessment need within the participant's department. Assessment Coaches will be available to provide tailored feedback and support through the planning and implementation of the assessment project.
